
#### The New Equipment has arrived at RHF!

# "I just read 10 Books!"

Zara is a first grader and the fourth of six children. She consistently attends our Homework Club at Emerald City Commons and works hard to earn her stars by completing her math workbook sheets. When she finished one of her workbooks, we encouraged her to take it home and share it with her parents. She said, "My parents never look at my homework." That made us wonder how much individual attention and help she receives with her studies.

At the beginning of this school year, Zara was clearly struggling with reading. Online learning did not work well for her in her cramped apartment. Over this past school year, we have been making sure that Zara reads out loud to us. On Mondays, you can find Zara and Glyn, a retired reading specialist, reading together in a corner of the Community Room. Glyn recently commented that often Zara will say, "This is too hard!" and then cross her arms and refuse to try.

Mike Davis joined our Youth Outreach ministry team this past March. At that same time, Mike had been invited to apply for a community partnership grant, ... a pilot project to support Youth and Families impacted by gun violence.

A few projects were in place attempting to prevent gun violence but this invitation was to support families and youth communities after a shooting has taken place. Mike took the vision of a network of church and community youth leaders and proposed that we create Critical Aftercare Response Teams. The teams would come from a network of churches representing all the key neighborhoods experiencing gun violence and would be equipped and available to care for families after the devastation of a shooting occurs. To be present in *hot spots* and youth communities creating a positive presence and supporting young people toward their God given potential.

The good news is that we received the grant and Mike has begun building the team and engaging our neighborhood churches and recruiting youth leaders.

When a shooting occurs, Mike and a "critical response team" are notified. They arrive on the scene and assess whose involved and what communities are impacted, they make initial connections and then work to get these Community Aftercare Support Teams involved. They meet youth and families where they are, visit hospitals, offer prayer and support, bring by bags of groceries, meet needs as they can and even offer a place for families to grieve host services and be the church.

We are excited to be part of this opportunity for the church to be the church and love on people impacted by difficult circumstances.
